(Education Act 2002)

5 January 2015

In exercise of the powers conferred by Section 20 of the Education Act 2002, (“the Act”), and after carrying out such consultations as are required to be carried out in accordance with provisions established under the Act. This instrument is being made in accordance with The School Governance (Constitution) (England) Regulations 2012. Cambridgeshire County Council, being the local authority, hereby make the following Order.

This Order may be cited as the Cambridgeshire County Council
(Instrument of Government for Community Schools) (Education Act 2002)
and shall come into force on 5 January 2015.

The instrument of government for the community school named in paragraph 1
overleaf shall be that set out in paragraphs 2 onwards.

The said instrument shall have effect in substitution for any
instrument of government for the said school in force immediately before the
coming into force of this Order, in accordance with paragraph 7 overleaf.

Paragraph

1. The name of the school is **THORNDOWN PRIMARY SCHOOL**.
2. The school is a **COMMUNITY SCHOOL**.
3. The name of the governing body is “**The governing body of Thorndown Primary School**”.
4. The governing body shall consist of:
 - a. 6 elected parent governors
 - b. 1 LA governor
 - c. 1 headteacher
 - d. 1 elected staff governor
 - e. 9 co-opted governors (of which up to 4 could be members of staff). The total number of co-opted governors who are also eligible to be elected as staff governors, so when counted with the elected staff governor and headteacher, must not exceed one third of the total membership of the governing body.
5. Total number of governors: **18**

(except at any time when the headteacher has given notice under Regulation 19 of the Constitution Regulations that s(he) chooses not to be a governor, when the total number of governors will be 17).
6. The term of office of all governors (other than the headteacher) is four years.
7. This instrument of government comes into effect on 5 January 2015.
8. This instrument was made by order of Cambridgeshire Local Authority on 5 January 2015.
9. A copy of the instrument must be supplied to every member of the governing body (and the headteacher if not a governor).
